Training:

As the recruit concluded on June 16th, the department took the week of the 18-24 to recognize and participate in Safety Stand Down Week. SSDW is a joint initiative of the International Association of Fire Chiefs and the National Volunteer Fire Council. During this week, FD's are asked to suspend all non-emergency activity allowing all shifts and personnel to focus on safety and health training and education. We conducted Safety and Survival training in three parts. All members reviewed and discussed lessons learned during a recent fire involving FF's trapped, injured, and a Line of Duty Death. All members then practiced rescuing a downed firefighter, identifying and discussing each role of the Rapid Intervention Team. The final phase consisted of each member participating in the safety and survival training involving techniques to escape entrapment by wires, wall breaching and movement through wall studs, hose coupling reading, ladder slides, window hangs, low air drills and calling a mayday.

Additionally, we had 3 firefighters complete an Advanced Search Techniques Course, each shift attended training on natural gas emergencies with Vectren, power line safety with Boone REMC, and all have completed MedBill compliance training about EMS reporting.

Chief Lanham completed training for developing and operating a UAV (Drone) program for the department. He also kept himself busy with attending a PIO related course at the Wayne Twp. Fire Department.



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Public Education / PR:

Conducted a “meet and greet” familiarization and fire safety talk with students at BACA.

Began videotaping of our latest PSA concerning opioid abuse issues. This is a project in conjunction with our partners at St. Vincent’s Hospital and should be rolling out soon!
