UPDATE:

1. LEXPOL Policy Review.

Our new policy review remains underway. As previously reported, the Police Commissioners began their review in August and continue to receive 10-12 polices each week for review through mid-November. This process will continue through the January 2018 PCM at which time, all polices are now scheduled for adoption with the roll out scheduled for February 1, 2018.
