## WMPD Report to Council September 2017

### UPDATE:

1. WMPD AED Purchase: (Six Units) 6 X \$1295ea = \$7,770.00 <Quote Attached>

The agency needs to purchase six (6) additional AED's for the new PSO's. The vendor, Cardiac Science is the lowest quote at \$1295 ea. The combine purchase price is above the \$5000-dollar spending limit, and requires Council approval. The Board of Police Commissioners review this item at their regular meeting on Tuesday, September 5, 2017 and voted unanimously to forward this to the full Council with a favorable adoption recommendation. The funding source will be from the Police, Other Services & Charges line.

2. Boone County SRT Van (Update) <Quote attached>

Sheriff Nielsen is requesting additional funding for the purchase of a new Joint Agency SRT Team Van. The original request from March 2017 of \$8,500 from each of the agencies who make up SRT will not cover the new vehicle vendor after it was discovered the previous vehicle spec was not large enough to accommodate the recent team expansion. Sheriff Nielsen is adding in an additional \$5000, and is requesting the same from WMPD, LPD and ZPD to cover the overall vehicle and build-up cost from each of the agencies 2018 budget.

The Board of Police Commissioners reviewed this matter at their September 5, 2017 meeting and voted unanimously to forward it to the full Council with a favorable adoption recommendation. The fund source will be the Police General Operating Service line of the 2018 budget.

### 3. Boone County – Animal Control Officer

This is an item that is long overdue and has been discussed for many years. The adoption of LIT last year has breathed new life into this effort countywide. Deputy Fisher of the BCSD has taken the lead on this and has developed the attached proposal for your consideration. This matter was discussed at the August 2017, County Chief Meeting where collectively the recommended that each of the large communities appropriate a \$10,000 annual budget line. As well, the Chief's recommend that the Councils of Whitestown, Lebanon and Zionsville adopt the new County Animal Control Ordinance that will then permit the County Animal Control Officer enforcement across political subdivision lines through an MOU.

I support this effort Countywide and recommend that the Town Council establish and appropriate annually a fund line for <TOWN> Animal Control Services from the Town General Funds.

2. Letter from Brian Larcom, Finance Controller and Budget Director at INDOT for our


repeated assistance in marking damaged INDOT assets allowing INDOT to recover damage costs. (PSO/Sgt. J. King)
