General Updates

Whitestown Metropolitan Police Department has been working diligently to accomplish the following:

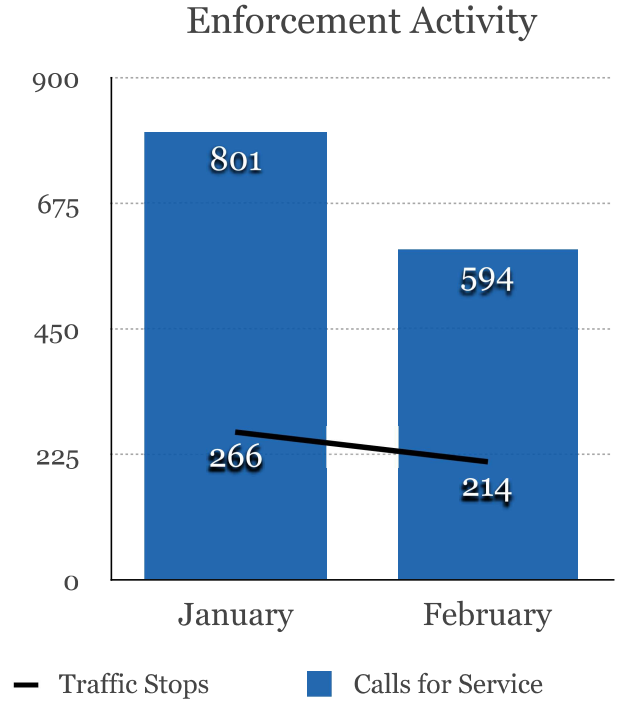
- The police department continues to be closed:
 - The police department is closed to visitors and business is being conducted by appointment only.
 - Officers are continuing to practice good safety precautions and wear their masks as they respond to calls. In addition, officers are responding to calls over the phone when possible.
- Satellite Office
 - WMPD has created an office space within the investigations division to provide Boone County Prosecutors a satellite office. This office will allow the prosecutors and WMPD officers to work together on a more regular basis.
- Hiring Process
 - On February 15, Officer Chris Anderson was sworn in as a full time PSO.
 - Opened a Lateral Hiring Process.
- Officer Klinger was promoted to Sergeant on February 21st.
