#### **Criminal Investigation Breakdown**

#### **Training Division**

- Investigation School
  - WMPD sent an officer through detective school. The school covered a variety of topics including but not limited to writing search warrants to understanding how to interview individuals who have experienced a traumatic event.
- Advanced Crime Scene Documentation
  - WMPD sent CSI Greene to advanced crime scene training. This training taught CSIs how to collect, analyze, and store blood evidence. Part of this course taught CSIs how to read and understand common patterns observed on crime scenes where blood is present.
- Bike Patrol School
  - WMPD sent Officer Pogorov to bike patrol school. Officer Pogorov will be out in the neighborhoods conducting patrols on his bicycle. Make sure to wave and say hello when you see him!
