General Updates

Whitestown Metropolitan Police Department has been working diligently to accomplish the following:

- Hiring Process
 - WMPD's hiring process is in full swing. We are continually developing and improving our hiring process to ensure we select the most qualified applicants to serve our community. We are currently in our oral interview phase, which will take place on Friday, November 5th.
- Hosting Training
 - WMPD has utilized the training room to bring the most current evidence based practices to the law enforcement profession. Our training room has hosted numerous multi-agency trainings just this past month alone, including part 1 of a multi week Crime Scene Investigator Course and "Policing the Teenage Brain."
- Body Worn Cameras
 - The entire department has been upgraded to the newest version of Axon Body Worn Cameras (Axon Body 3). WMPD is scheduled to upgrade our body worn camera technology every 2 years.
- Law Enforcement Appreciation Day
 - WMPD participated in the Boone County Law Enforcement Appreciation Event that took place at the court house. The event honored the history of Boone County Law Enforcement and allowed law enforcement professional to pay their respects to those officers who lost their lives in the line of duty. WMPD members participated in the event by serving in the Honor Guard Presentation and reading select passages commemorating law enforcement's dedication and service to their community.

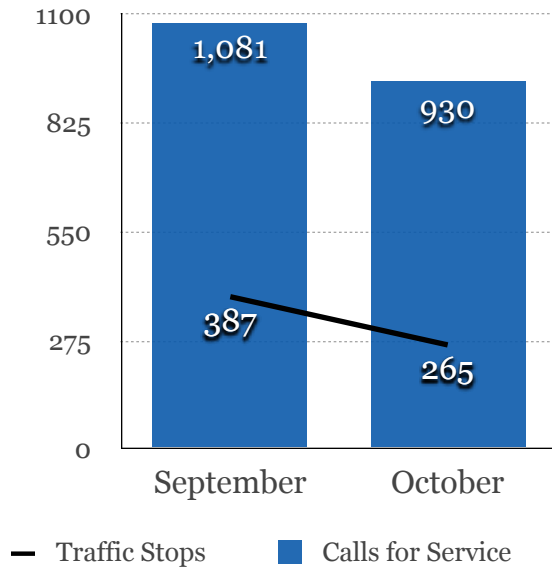

These crimes are classified into 3 primary categories: *crimes against property* (thefts, hit and runs, criminal mischief, etc...), *crime against persons* (battery, burglary, sexual misconduct, etc...), and *cyber investigations* (forensic examination of telecommunication devices: computers, external hard drives, phones).
