

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

On or about June 28, 2019 the Town of Whitestown intends to apply to the Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs for a grant from the State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Wastewater/Drinking Water Program. This program is funded by Title I of the federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. These funds are to be used for a community development project that will include the following activities: Improvements to the Town's water mains within the Legacy Core of Whitestown. The total amount of CDBG funds to be requested is \$700,000.00. The amount of CDBG funds proposed to be used for activities that will benefit low- and moderate-income persons is \$429,800.00. The Town also proposes to expend an estimated \$320,000.00 in non-CDBG funds on the project. These non-CDBG funds will be derived from the following sources: Water Fund.

The Town of Whitestown will hold a public hearing on June 12, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Hall located at 6210 Veterans Dr., Whitestown, IN 46075. The purpose of the public hearing is to provide interested parties an opportunity to express their views on the proposed federally funded CDBG project. Every effort will be made to make reasonable accommodations for these persons.

Interested citizens are invited to provide comments regarding these issues either at the public hearing or by prior written statement. A plan to minimize displacement and provide assistance to those displaced has been prepared by the Town of Whitestown and is also available to the public.
