Whitestown Metropolitan Police Department has been working diligently to accomplish the following:

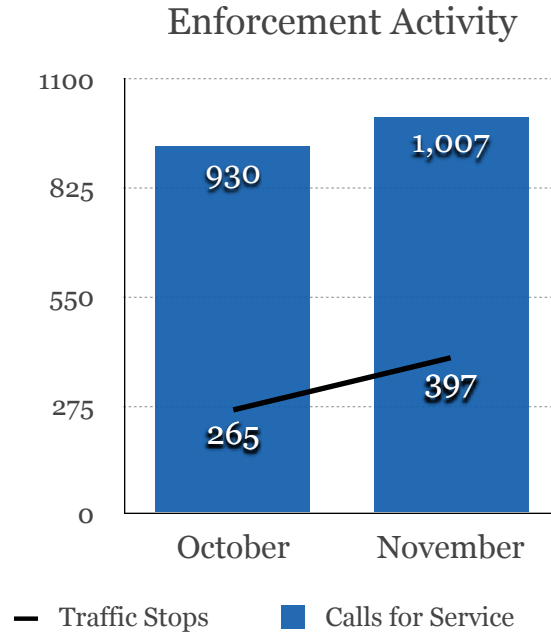
- Hiring Process
