



WMPD strives to ensure that our members are mentally and physically prepared to best serve and protect our community by going above and beyond in our training efforts. This month, our officers were busy completing <u>655 hours of training</u>. Various disciplines were covered in our training efforts including firearms, physical tactics, use of force, Emergency Medical, leadership, legal updates, administrative updates, and simulator/scenarios. Some training highlights from this busy month are below.

- WMPD completed our first Quarterly Training of the year, focusing our training topics on CPR/AED Recertification, Close Quarters Combat/Battle (CQB), and Firearms in Low Light Situations.
- Officer C. Anderson and Officer Frith completed the 80-hour basic Police Motorcycle Certification course.
- Admin Assistant Jody Halcomb, Sgt. Klinger, and Det. Turney attended "Supporting Heroes" training at WFD Station 72, learning skills and resources to assist our officers and their families in the event of a line of duty death.
- All WMPD Field Training Officers (FTOs) completed a 1-Day internal training workshop on our Field Training Program prior to bringing on new trainees this spring.
- Officer Sellers and Officer Wolfe attended the 2023 Street Cop Conference in Nashville, TN. The conference covered a variety of topics including Leadership, Investigations, and Traffic Stops.
- Sgt. King attended the 2023 Trainers Conference at the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy.
- Detective Hernandez attended a 3-Day Advanced Human Trafficking course in Jeffersonville, IN.
- Sgt. King provided Active Shooter Training for the Little League World Series staff/employees.
