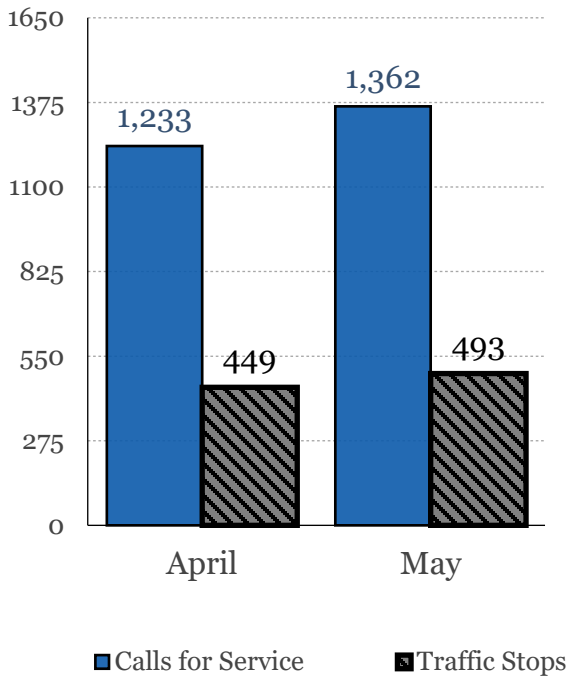

Officers' enforcement activity the past month yielded the following case and arrest reports.

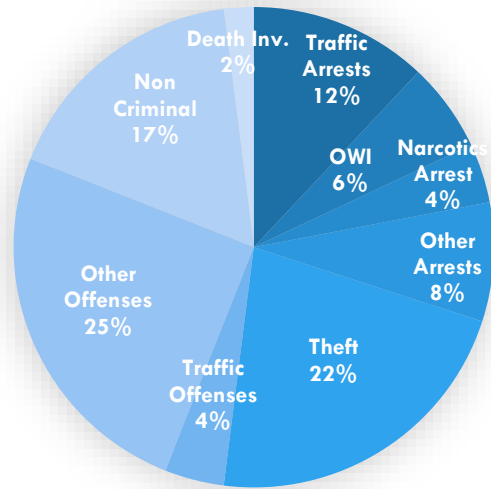

- All WMPD members completed their 2nd bi-annual Firearms Qualification, as well as completed Patrol Rifle Qualifications.
- Sgt. Root attended Emergency Vehicle Operation Instructor training at ILEA and is now a Department EVO Instructor.
- Officer Sellers and Officer Wolfe attended the “Street Cop Annual Conference” in Nashville, TN where they attended numerous training sessions and seminars to enhance their patrol skills.
- Detective Turney, Officer Gipson, Officer Pogorov, and Officer Williams attended “Leadership Without Rank” training in Brownsburg, learning effective ways to be leaders within the department.
- Sgt. King provided active shooter training to all Town employees at the Whitestown Municipal Complex.
