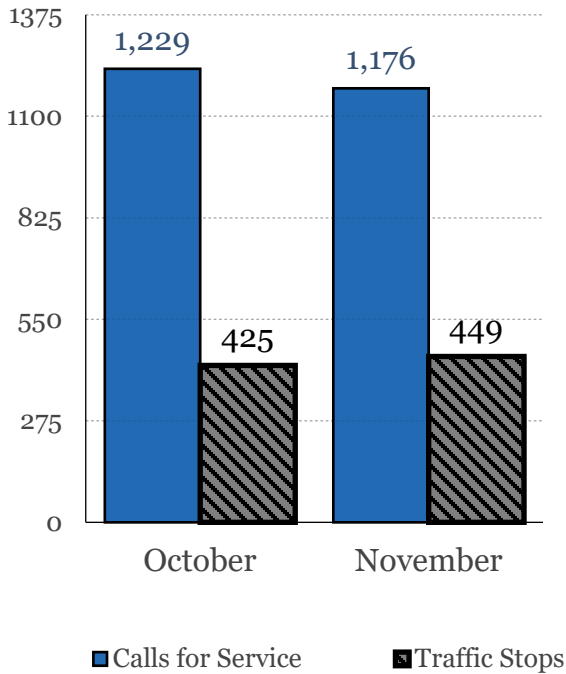

Officers’ enforcement activity the past month yielded the following case and arrest reports.

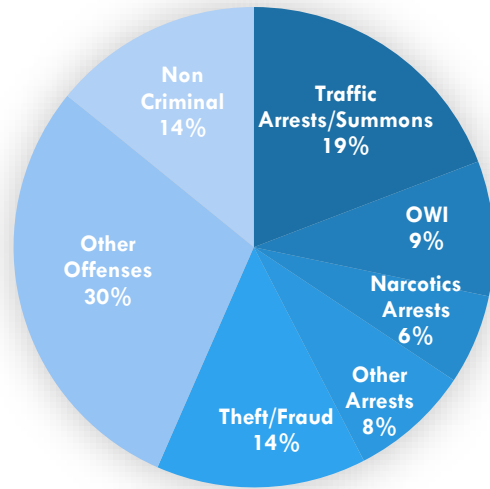
