## General PD Updates

The officers at WMPD have continued to work diligently in their service and protection of the Whitestown Community. While it is difficult to account for every task and accomplishment on an individual and Department wide level, some updates and highlights are below.

- Members of WMPD partnered with Town of Whitestown staff for the Boone County Economic Development Corporation Day of Service. Volunteers assisted in cleaning up different parks, as well as helped the Isaiah 117 house transition from summer to winter preparation.
- WMPD partnered with WFD and Lowe’s Home Improvement for their Public Safety Kids Clinic, hosted at the Whitestown Lowe’s location. Turnout was great and we were thankful to be able to interact with members of the community throughout the event.
- WMPD hosted two self-defense courses. The first was for Indiana Home Care Services to better prepare them for how to handle day to day interactions. The second was our Women’s Self Defense class, empowering women in the community to take their safety into their own hands and best protect themselves.

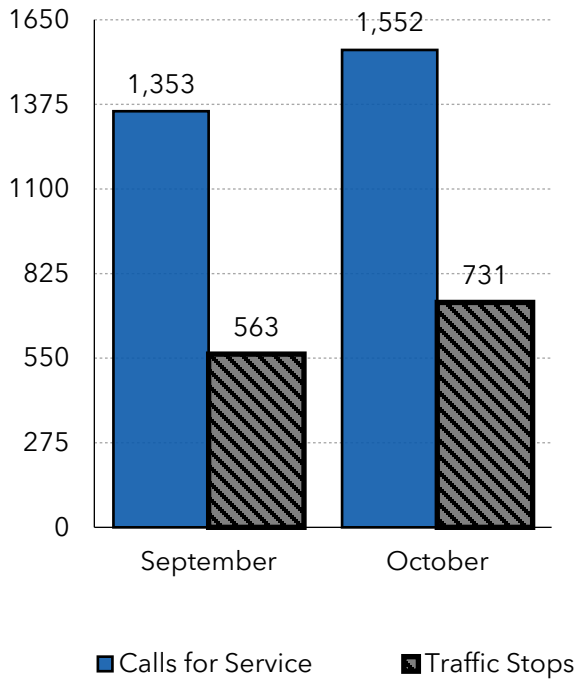
### Patrol Division

Officers’ enforcement activity the past month yielded the following case and arrest reports.

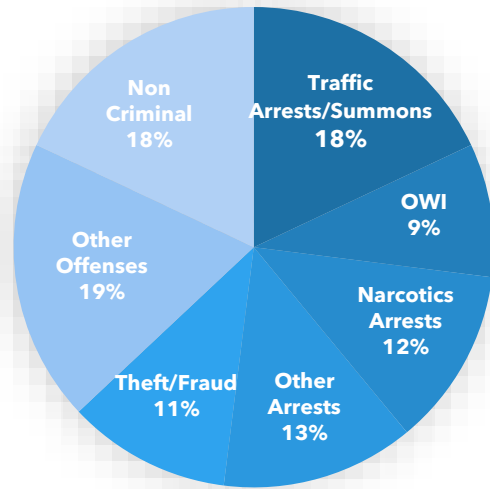

These crimes are classified into three (3) primary categories: *crimes against property* (thefts, hit and runs, criminal mischief, etc.), *crime against persons* (battery, burglary, sexual misconduct, etc.), and *cyber investigations* (forensic examination of telecommunication devices: computers, external hard drives, phones).

## Training Division

WMPD strives to ensure that our members are mentally and physically prepared to best serve and protect our community by going above and beyond in our training efforts. This month, our officers were busy completing **728 hours of training**. Various disciplines were covered in our training efforts including firearms, physical tactics, use of force, Emergency Medical, leadership, legal updates, administrative updates, and simulator/scenarios. Some training highlights from this busy month are below.

- WMPD held our final Quarterly Training of the year, where officers trained on Defensive Tactics (including vehicle extractions, multiple officer take-downs and control techniques, and weapon entanglement) and Low Light/Night Shooting.
- Det. Gabe Frietzsche and Ofc. Kyle Haskins attended Instructor Development.
- All members completed a virtual training through Police One Academy on Due Regard when using emergency vehicles in emergency situations.
- WMPD Hosted "Pro-Active Patrol" training course through Street Cop, in which four of our members were also students.
- Sgt. Scott Klinger attended Emotional Survival in Law Enforcement training.
- Ofc. Cale McCarty attended "Desert Snow" interdiction training.
