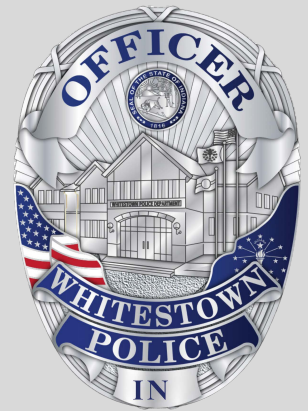

General PD Updates

The officers at WMPD have continued to work diligently in their service and protection of the Whitestown Community. While it is difficult to account for every task and accomplishment on an individual and Department wide level, some updates and highlights are below.

- WMPD started our newest officer, David Cornett. In addition to completing his initial onboarding, Officer Cornett completed training in Defensive Tactics, Policy Review, Taser 10 certification, Report Writing, and Physical Fitness in Law Enforcement. He is currently shadowing at the Boone County Jail, and upon returning to us will complete his remaining Patrol School before entering Field Training.
- Following design and production of a new badge, WMPD has started transitioning out our prior badge in a multi-phase process. New badges have been handed out to all rank and file, and we have installed new décor throughout the Police Department showcasing our new custom badge. We are slowly replacing our old badges on uniforms and over the next few months all officers will be proudly sporting our new badges in their daily responsibilities. This was a multi-month project, and we'd like to give special thanks to those asked to be on the badge design committee as they helped in establishing a legacy highlight for future generations of WMPD.

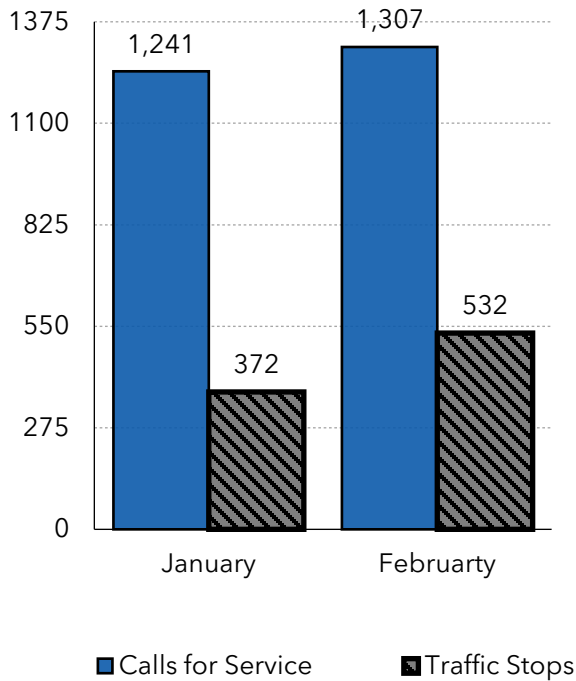

Officers' enforcement activity the past month yielded the following case and arrest reports.

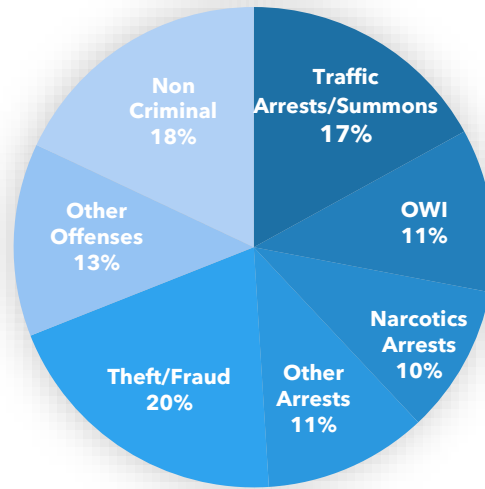

Investigations Division

These crimes are classified into three (3) primary categories: *crimes against property* (thefts, hit and runs, criminal mischief, etc.), *crime against persons* (battery, burglary, sexual misconduct, etc.), and *cyber investigations* (forensic examination of telecommunication devices: computers, external hard drives, phones).

Training Division

WMPD strives to ensure that our members are mentally and physically prepared to best serve and protect our community by going above and beyond in our training efforts. This month, our officers were busy completing **520 hours of training**. Various disciplines were covered in our training efforts including firearms, physical tactics, use of force, Emergency Medical, leadership, legal updates, administrative updates, and simulator/scenarios. Some training highlights from this busy month are below.

- All WMPD members completed cold weather firearms training, practicing various skills in weapon manipulation while exposed to cold, as well as wearing cold weather apparel.
- All WMPD members completed monthly Defensive Tactics training, as we aim to home in our hand to hand skills through monthly review and instruction.
- All Command level supervisors (Chief, Captains, and Lieutenants) completed Managing Critical Incident Training. This training was designed to best prepare our staff to mentally prepare for various types of critical incidents, while practicing skills that will help prioritize safety and organization in the midst of a rapidly evolving dynamic incident. Captains and Lieutenants will then conduct this training on shift with their personnel, helping to improve the skills of all members.
- K9 Officer Lockwood and his partner K9 Jeeter completed over 200 hours of training to certify in patrol, tracking, and narcotics through Ultimate K9.
- Ofc. Parks attended the Reid Interview and Interrogation School, learning advanced techniques and skills that can be utilized during criminal investigations.
- WMPD's 6 members assigned to the Boone County Special Response Team (SRT) attended and completed a 3-day Close Quarters Tactical (CQT) skills training through NORSE Tactical along with other members from the SRT from all Boone County agencies.
