General PD Updates

The officers at WMPD have continued to work diligently in their service and protection of the Whitestown Community. While it is difficult to account for every task and accomplishment on an individual and Department wide level, some updates and highlights are below.

- WMPD's newest officer, David Cornett, completed his five (5) week Patrol School, and has started our Field Training Program. Over the next several months, Officer Cornett will be trained in the day to day functions and responsibilities of WMPD Officers by Field Training Officers across all shifts on the Department.
- All WMPD members attended our first Quarterly Training of 2025 at the Brownsburg Police Training Facility. During this training, all members completed dynamic training on topics including Close Quarter Tactics, Low Light Shooting, and Tactical Medicine/Tourniquet Application.
- Members of our B Nightshift along with our Wellness Program attended Traders Point Christian School's Wild West Spring Fest and hosted a "Heroes Table" along with WFD. Here we were able to interact with families in our community and outside of our community who attend TPCS to speak with them about what we do, as well as to hand out swag and show off some of our gear. WMPD's future Therapy K9 Barqs also made an appearance as part of his training!

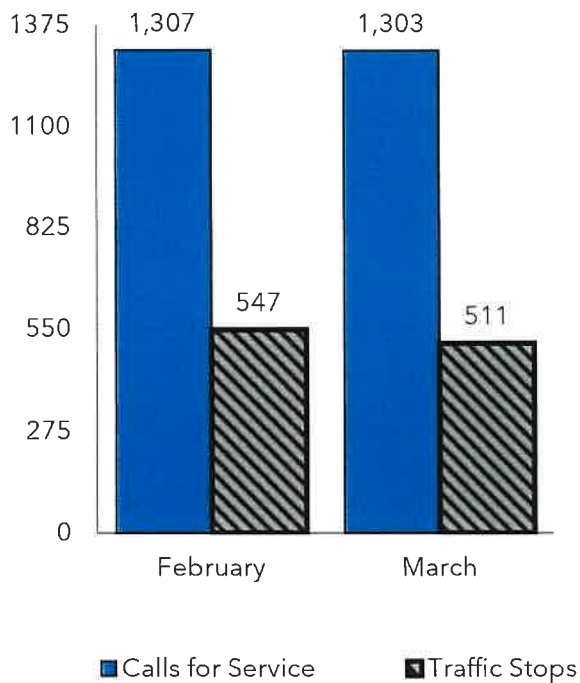

Training Division

WMPD strives to ensure that our members are mentally and physically prepared to best serve and protect our community by going above and beyond in our training efforts. This month, our officers were busy completing **636 hours of training**. Various disciplines were covered in our training efforts including firearms, physical tactics, use of force, Emergency Medical, leadership, legal updates, administrative updates, and simulator/scenarios. Some training highlights from this busy month are below.

- All WMPD members completed STOPS training, reviewing different tactics to utilize when approaching a vehicle, how to deal with difficult or argumentative drivers/passengers, and counter-ambush tactics.
- Captain John Jurkash attended a Background Investigation for Police Applicants training class that was hosted at WMPD.
- Detective Tibbs attended a three day Advanced Criminal Investigations Course.
- Following last month's training for Command Staff members on Managing Critical Incidents, Shift/Division supervisors have begun conducting this training with respective personnel so that all members of WMPD have a better understanding of roles and responsibilities of Managing Critical Incidents.
