

RESOLUTION NO. 2025-19

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WHITESTOWN, INDIANA,
ADOPTING A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN AND PROGRAM FOR THE TOWN**

WHEREAS, the Town of Whitestown, Indiana (“Town”) is a municipality duly organized and existing under the provisions of Ind. Code § 36-5-1; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ind. Code § 36-5-2-2, the Town Council (“Town Council”) of the Town is the legislative body of the Town;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ind. Code § 36-5-2-9, the Town Council may adopt ordinances and resolutions for the performance of the functions of the Town; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ind. Code § 6-3.6-6-9.5, the executive of the Town may adopt a capital improvement plan specifying uses of revenue to be allocated for economic development purposes; and

WHEREAS, Indiana Code § 6-3.6-6-9.5(e) provides that the capital improvement plan must encompass a period of not less than two (2) years, and must be adopted before a town may receive its certified distribution of revenue allocated for economic development purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Town now finds that it is in the best interests of the Town to adopt a Capital Improvement Plan and Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council for the Town of Whitestown, Indiana, as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. The Town Council hereby adopts the Capital Improvement Plan and Program of the Town of Whitestown (“CIPP”), as attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Section 3. The CIPP provides a strategic framework for identifying, prioritizing, and funding the Town’s transportation infrastructure improvements, and shall be re-evaluated at least every third year, if not earlier, to reaffirm or reprioritize the capital improvement projects for the Town.

Section 4. The provisions of this Resolution are severable. If any part is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, invalid, or unenforceable, that determination will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution so long as enforcement of same can be given the same effect. The court shall, to the extent permitted by law, substitute a valid and enforceable provision that most closely reflects the intent of the original.

Section 5. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its adoption.
